

# **Mini-Grant Request for Applications: FY2024**

Funding Available: \$15,000 with awards of up to \$5,000 each

# **Mini-Grant Description**

The NCIPMC has funds available for mini-grants to be awarded to eligible projects that will enable the recipient to accomplish small projects or activities in support of increasing IPM in the region. Mini-grant proposals are expected to focus on integrated pest management, address at least one Center priority, and form regional collaborations where possible.

The Regional IPM Centers champion the development and adoption of integrated pest management, the science of managing pests while protecting people, the environment and economy. Each Center engages broadly with stakeholders to identify and address regional pest priorities in agriculture, communities, and natural areas. This mission directly serves the goals of the IPM Roadmap (<a href="http://bit.ly/IPMRoadMap">http://bit.ly/IPMRoadMap</a>).

Proposals should address priorities within our Signature Programs:

- Protect diverse cropping systems, human and animal health and environmental resources with IPM.
- Ensuring food security by preparing for disruptive forces such as climate change, pest resistance and invasive species.
- Protecting pollinators and other beneficial insects.

### **Eligibility**

The lead Project Director (PD) submitting the application must reside in the North Central region, although project participants may reside outside the region. Eligible applicants include private individuals and institutions, faculty and qualified staff of four-year universities, businesses, commodity organizations, and governmental and non-governmental organizations. Applications originating from or including small, mid-sized and minority-serving institutions or organizations are particularly encouraged.

### **Funding**

Funding up to \$5,000 per award. Matching funds are not required. Indirect costs are not allowed.

Examples of mini-grant topics include, but are not limited to the following:

- Identification of North Central region research and extension priorities that include stakeholder input. These priorities must clearly demonstrate needs in agricultural, natural or urban settings.
- Develop proposals to address North Central region priorities for submission to funding entities.
- Conduct outreach programs and develop IPM related educational materials.
- Develop or revise crop profiles or pest management strategic plans.
- Develop IPM guidelines, management guides or pest alerts.
- Plan and host a training conference or teleconference on a critical issue.
- Develop timely IPM responses to critical pest issues.

All complete applications received will be acknowledged. Applications will be reviewed by NCIPMC staff with the following criteria:

Once proposed activities are completed and you provide us with a summary report a payment will be issued to you (or your organization) by Iowa State University.

Proposed activities must be completed within 1 year of the start date of your award.
